Following the first webinar on Virtual Exchange, the first training "Introduction to Virtual Exchange", organised by UNICollaboration\_for the ERUA' partners, will be held online, on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> from 09:00 to 13:00 CET.

Participants will be introduced to different models of Virtual Exchange (class-to-class and readymade) and how these can offer their students an international and intercultural experience, and help them develop soft skills such as digital literacies, collaboration skills and critical thinking.
